

# Case Seminar II: Lymphoid Disorders

# Clinical Histories

1. (Dr. LJ Medeiros) 77 year old woman with left foot swelling. Doppler ultrasound negative for deep venous thrombosis but showed left inguinal lymphadenopathy. Imaging showed enlarged cervical, mediastinal, retroperitoneal, and mesenteric lymph nodes that were hyperbolic, and 7 cm necrotic mass with a hypermetabolic rim in the left pelvis.
2. (Dr. R. Pillai) 40 year old white man who presented with small, partially crusted and centrally ulcerated papules in 2008. Diagnosed as mycosis fungoides, tumor stage. Underwent allogeneic stem cell transplantation for a large cell transformation 3 years later. Cutaneous lesions returned two years post transplantation.
3. (Dr. S. Loghavi) 58 year old woman with a history of breast implants who was found to have multifocal hypermetabolic osseous lesions on PET-CT scan.
4. (Dr. B. Nathwani) 5 year old boy with bilateral neck masses.
